2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

(1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'Les Fries Cottage' is a 1950's one and a half storey cottage with a 1980's one and a half storey extension at the rear. The house is set back from and faces west onto Ruelle de Fries. There is a flat roof double garage facing west on the eastern boundary. There is a neighbouring property to the north and an old vinery to the south with open fields to the east and west. The property is located Outside of the Centres and within the Agriculture Priority Area as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Relevant History:

FULL/2020/0256 - Demolish porch, erect flat roof extension to south-east (side) elevation and install external insulation. Remove garage door and install patio doors to detached garage – March 2020.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to demolish the existing rear garage/outbuilding and to erect a new detached single garage adjacent to the south gable elevation, remove hedge and alterations to the earthbank and alter the vehicular entrance.

The southeast boundary hedge is not actually in the correct place, and it needs to be removed for the true boundary line to be used. The existing hedge is very patchy and in some areas has already disappeared, there is not much greenery on the hedge and so its removal is not thought to cause any detriment to the biodiversity of the area.

The fence which is going to replace the boundary will start at 2m high adjacent to the new garage, and it then steps down to 1.5m, then 1.2m with the two panels nearest the road being 0.9m. The fence is considered to appropriately provide privacy where it needs to and allows for sight lines closer to the road.

The rear outbuilding is not considered to have any architectural worth and so its removal is considered to be appropriate. There are no concerns about the new blockwork single garage to be located alongside the main dwelling.

The scale and massing of the new garage is not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding area, nor will it have any impact on either of the immediate neighbours.

Policy GP9: Sustainable Development seeks to ensure all new development takes into account the use of energy and resources and any adverse impacts on the environment. There has been sufficient information provided with the application to comply with the requirements of this policy.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land and Planning (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
