Conditions and reasons:-

1. All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter

period as may be specified in the permission).

3. The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

4. The shed shall be used only for agricultural purposes falling within Agricultural Use Class 28 of the Land Planning and Development (Use Classes) Ordinance, 2007, or in any provision equivalent to that Use Class in any Ordinance revoking or re-enacting that Ordinance.

Reason - Permission has been granted on the basis that the use will be limited to that outlined above. Any other use is likely to raise different planning policy considerations.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 28/06/2025 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

The application site is located within an area of known archaeological importance and your attention is drawn to the provisions of the Island Development Plan, Annex VIII on Archaeological Assessment.

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

- (1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date

on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. The official Appeal Notice Forms are available on the States of Guernsey website at www.gov.gg/planningpanel and must be completed with all enclosures in multiples as requested and received within the six months deadline.

OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

Planning permission is requested to erect an agricultural shed along the south boundary. The shed is proposed to be of a single storey lean-to construction measuring 5m by 12m by 3m (high) with sage green corrugated sheet metal walls.

The site contains a 1½ storey pitched roof building which was approved as 3 light industrial units in November 2017 and an associated outbuilding in the north-east corner, both of which are served by a gravelled track running along the east boundary. The remainder of the site comprises of agricultural land laid to grass. The site is located Outside of the Centres and is in an area of known archaeological importance.

Relevant History:

24/04/2018 – FULL/2018/0420 – Permission granted for variations to plans previously approved to demolish greenhouse and outbuildings and erect 3 light industrial units and an associated outbuilding - Replace 2 rooflights with dormer windows (west elevation), alterations to courtyard finish and amend timber cladding.

24/11/2017 – FULL/2017/1586 – Permission granted to demolish greenhouse and outbuildings and erect 3 light industrial units and an associated outbuilding.

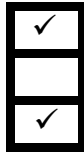

Conclusion/Brief comment:

During the course of consideration further information was requested regarding the proposed use of the shed. The agent subsequently submitted additional information identifying the land the shed would be used in association with, how those parcels of land would be used, the equipment to be stored in the shed, why existing buildings cannot be used for the intended purpose and how the land parcels are currently managed. The information is sufficient to demonstrate that the proposed shed would be ancillary and essential to the agricultural use of the land and there are no buildings which could be used for the proposed purposes, in accordance with Policy OC5(B).

The design and materials of the shed achieves a good standard of design. The shed would be visible from La Route de La Lande to the east but due to a combination of its modest size, its single storey design and its siting adjacent to a high granite wall along the south boundary, the shed is unlikely to have a significant adverse effect on the openness and landscape character of the area, in accordance with Policies GP1 and GP8.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land and Planning (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.

It is recommended that the application is approved.
