NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Installation of cable to link two substations.

LOCATION: L'Ancrese Common, Les Clotures Road, Vale.

APPLICANT: Guernsey Electricity Limited

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

4.Notwithstanding the details shown on the approved plans, prior to the commencement of any trenching hereby approved, full details of

a) the exact route for the trenching; and
b) the location of a storage area for the storage of plant, machinery and materials shall be submitted for written approval of the Authority. The work shall be carried out in accordance with the agreed details and all excavation plant, machinery and materials associated with the approved development shall be stored within the agreed storage area.

Reason - To limit the impact of the proposal on the surrounding SSS in accordance with the submitted Ecological Report and to comply with the provisions of Policy GP2 of the IDP.

5.Any turf removed in the excavation of the trenches hereby approved shall be carefully retained on the site and once the cables have been laid, the trenches shall be back filled with the original soil and the turfs replaced within a timeframe previously agreed in writing by the Authority.

Reason - To limit the impact of the proposal on the surrounding SSS in accordance with the submitted Ecological Report and to comply with the provisions of Policy GP2 of the IDP.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 01/08/2025 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

The application site is located within an area of known archaeological importance and your attention is drawn to the provisions of the Island Development Plan, Annex VIII on Archaeological Assessment.

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

- (1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).
- (2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.
- (3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.
- (4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.
- (5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The site runs along the north of Les Clotures Road and Les Mielles Road which forms part of commons land. A low lying verge exists along much of the roadside area of land however a car park is situated off Les Mielles Road and various hills/rocky outcrops require the proposed cable installation to be diverted north.

The site is located Outside of the Centres and within a Site of Special Significance and Archaeological Area as designated in the Island Development Plan.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

The proposal relates to the installation of electricity cables running alongside La Clotures Road. This would involve the digging of 300mm wide trenches dug at a depth of 950mm.

The site is located within a Site of Special Significance and the proposal comprises minor works not requiring an Environmental Impact Assessment as set out under Schedule 1 or 2 of the Land Planning and Development (Environmental Impact Assessment) Ordinance, 2007 or Section 40(5) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

Notwithstanding the above, it is a requirement under the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005, when considering applications affecting a Site of Special Significance that special attention is paid to the desirability of preserving, enhancing and managing the character, appearance and environment of the site. This approach is reinforced through Policy GP2.

In summary the main environmental impacts are:

- Damage to species rich habitats during and after work
- Noise and visual disturbance associated with works
- Visual disturbance
- Disturbance of birds
- Disturbance of sensitive species

The submission sets out various mitigation measures to reduce the environmental impacts to an acceptable level:

Excavation Phase

1. Confirm cabling route with La Societe Guernesiaise
2. Establish suitable route protection zone around the lone Hawthorn tree at east end of site
3. Be watchful of wildlife (e.g. ground nesting birds, slow worms etc.)
4. Restrict works to minimal area
5. Avoid excessive machinery movements/manoeuvring on grassland
6. Retain turfs separately from cable trench and backfill trench with original soil and turfs within one week
7. Avoid storing heavy plant, materials or excavated materials on grassland areas

Restoration phase and beyond

- a) Restore incidental damage to grassland areas
- b) Monitor surrounds for six months until fully restored and settled
- c) Irrigate restored trench route in very dry conditions
- d) Manually repair areas excessively damaged by rabbits

The report concludes by stating that the trenching through species rich dune grassland could cause significant damage to the site, lasting several years or beyond. As a result therefore, it is critical that the trenching follows the agreed route and that the turfs are carefully removed and retained. The trench should be backfilled with

the original soil and the turfs replaced carefully/firmed down and the site monitored following completion (matters that can be controlled by condition).

Based on the above, it is recommended that permission is granted subject to appropriate conditions and informative notes. Subject to these conditions/informative it is considered that the environmental impacts of the proposal would be reduced to an acceptable level (in accordance with the conclusions of the report). The proposal is therefore unlikely to adversely affect the special interest of the Site of Special Significance in accordance with Policy GP2.

In terms of landscape character, the works would largely be subterranean and of low visual impact. For the reasons contained within this report it is considered that the proposal accords with the above mentioned Policies of the Island Development Plan

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land and Planning (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
