NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Demolish extension, extend and alter at ground floor and 1st floor level, install dormer windows and balcony at 2nd floor level to south (rear) elevation, install rooflights to north (front) elevation.

LOCATION: Amboise, Les Camps Du Moulin, St. Martin.

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development

(Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3. The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 25/10/2025 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

- (1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).
- (2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.
- (3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.
- (4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.
- (5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any

other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'Amboise' is a two storey semi-detached Victorian dwelling which is set back from and faces north onto Les Camps du Moulin. The other semi is attached on the east side and there are other residential dwellings to the west, south and across the road to the north are open fields. The property is located Outside of the Centres as defined in the Island Development Plan.

There is no relevant history pertaining to this application.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to demolish the existing single storey extension, extend and alter at ground and first floor levels, install dormer windows and install rooflights to the front roof slope.

The ground floor extension includes an infill section, housing a utility room and then a new single storey open plan kitchen further south. At first floor above the utility there will be a small extension to enlarge the family bathroom. The proposals also

include an attic conversion with two dormer windows to the rear and three small roof lights to the front elevation.

Initially, the proposals included a second floor balcony, which would give more opportunity to overlook the semi-detached neighbours garden. This is due to the orientation of the building in contrast with the orientation of the gardens. The plots lie north/south and the dwellings are aligned northwest/southeast, this means Amboise rear elevation looks down the end of the neighbours garden rather than their own.

The applicant was requested to omit the balcony, the drawings were amended changing the balcony to a Juliette balcony instead. A Juliette balcony is a better option, it reduces the perception of being overlooked, and lessens the overall impact. The semi detached neighbour already has two second floor windows, and so with that as a precedent, the dormer proposals are thought, on balance, to be acceptable.

The proposals are thought to achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The extension will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The scale and massing of the new proposals are not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding area, nor will they have any detrimental impacts on either of the immediate neighbours.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land and Planning (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
