NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Raise and alter roof form to create accommodation at 1st floor level and erect single storey extension to west (front) and east (rear) elevations. Install external insulating render system and alterations to fenestration.

LOCATION: Coeur de Cobo, Rue Des Renouards, Ruelle De La Tour, Castel.

This permission is granted under the terms of Sections 15 and 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 (the 'Law').

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 18/01/2026 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

- (1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).
- (2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.
- (3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.
- (4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. A copy of any consultation responses made under section 11 will be included with this decision in accordance with section 19 of the Ordinance.

You must also ensure that any access/es to the development are constructed to meet the existing road/footway levels in accordance with their requirements.

A separate Building Control Licence may be required and it is the responsibility of the developer to ensure that ALL necessary consents are obtained and that any pre-commencement conditions are discharged prior to development being commenced.

OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'Coeur de Cobo' is a detached 1930's hipped roof bungalow, which is set back from and faces west onto Rue des Renouards. There are neighbouring properties to the north and south, a small housing estate to the east at a higher level and some other detached dwellings to the west across the road at a lower level. The property is located in the Cobo Local Centre as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Relevant History:

There is no relevant history pertaining to this application.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

Raise ridge height and alter roof form to create first floor accommodation, keeping the existing pitch on the front elevation. Erect a single storey flat roof extension to rear and single storey front extension, under the new pitched roof. Install external insulating render system and some alterations to the fenestration.

Initially the application was deferred because there was a first floor window on the north elevation, which would have caused overlooking into the neighbouring property's living room. The window was omitted and an additional front dormer was added, which is westward looking over the empty plot across the road and the coast beyond.

Policy GP8, amongst other things, expects new development to achieve a good standard of architectural design, to make the most effective and efficient use of land and to respect the character of the local built environment. It highlights that multi-storey buildings are a more efficient use of land than single storey buildings and it states that development proposals should consider a multi-storey design from the outset, unless there are overriding reasons why this design approach would be unacceptable within a particular locality.

Although the property sits on the crest of a hill looking towards the coast, many of the other properties along the crest have had alterations, which means there is not one particular style of property. Therefore the scale and massing of the new proposals are not thought to have any detrimental impacts on the character of the area.

The proposals achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The extension will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The proposed first floor windows have been carefully located, for the least amount of overlooking. The property to the north have had several extensions along their south boundary which limits the amount of overlooking from Coeur de Cobo. The first floor window will have some views into the southerly neighbours garden, but due to the angle it will only be of the end of the garden and not the most private amenity space, close to the dwelling. On balance the distance and orientation mitigate the amount of overlooking to an acceptable level.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land and Planning (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
