NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Erect moveable field shelter on agricultural land.

LOCATION: Les Landes Farm, Rue De Friquet, Castel.

This permission is granted under the terms of Sections 15 and 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 (the 'Law').

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 26/10/2026 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

- (1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).
- (2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.
- (3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.
- (4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The site known as 'Les Landes Farm' comprises the farm house, which lies to the west of Rue du Friquet and three large fields to the northwest and west of the property. To the east of the fields is the ribbon development to the west of Rue de Friquet (north of the farm house), to the south of the fields is the ribbon development to the north of Route de Cobo and to the west and north of the fields is open agricultural land. The property is located Outside of the Centres and is within the Agriculture Priority Area as defined in the Island Development Plan.

There is no relevant history pertaining to this application.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to erect a 7.4m x 3.6m moveable field shelter in the middle field of the farm, in the southeast corner of the agricultural land. The shelter will sit on stainless steel skids and be moved between two locations in the middle field of the farm.

The middle field has access to the western field in the southwest corner and access to the eastern field in the southeast corner and horses and/or cows are kept in the field all year round as part of a small holding. The field has been used for over 18 years to keep animals, previously there was a large static shelter on the land which has deteriorated over the years leaving the animals with nowhere to shelter or get warm.

The structure has been designed specifically as an animal shelter and is considered to be acceptable in terms of policy GP8.

Policy OC5(A) provides support for development which is related to the agricultural use of an existing farmstead or existing agricultural holding, or where development is proposed which would be ancillary or ordinarily incidental to the principal agricultural use.

The use of the structure would be to allow the animals kept on the land to have shelter and warmth when they need it, so it is considered to be an ancillary use in connection with the main agricultural use of the land. Therefore the proposal is considered to comply with policy OC5(A).

The south boundary of the field comprises a mature hedgerow full of native species and several mature trees which will help to screen the structure from view. However the field cannot be seen from any public vantage points. The timber structure is considered to respect the landscape character being made of natural materials and it does not result in any unacceptable loss of any specific distinctive feature within the landscape.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land and Planning (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
