NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Demolish existing extensions, erect single storey extension with raised terrace area and shed to north-west (rear) elevation. (Protected Building).

LOCATION: La Chanterelle, 81 Mount Durand, St. Peter Port.

This permission is granted under the terms of Sections 15 and 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 (the 'Law').

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 22/02/2027 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

(1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. A copy of any consultation responses made under section 11 will be included with this decision in accordance with section 19 of the Ordinance.

You must also ensure that any access/es to the development are constructed to meet the existing road/footway levels in accordance with their requirements.

A separate Building Control Licence may be required and it is the responsibility of the developer to ensure that ALL necessary consents are obtained and that any pre-commencement conditions are discharged prior to development being commenced.

OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'La Chanterelle' is an early 19th century terraced two and a half storey dwelling which is set back from and faces south onto Mount Durand. The attached dwellings are to the east and west, with other neighbouring properties to the south across the road and beyond the garden to the north. The property is located in the St Peter Port Main Centre and Conservation Area as defined in the Island Development Plan. La Chanterelle is a Protected Building.

Relevant History:

There is no relevant history pertaining to this application.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to demolish the existing single storey rear extension and to erect a larger single storey extension with raised terrace area and erect a shed to the northwest rear boundary.

The shed comprises exempt development and so will not be assessed as part of this report.

The proposal entails removal of the long single-storey extension which is part of the protected building. This, therefore, constitutes partial demolition of the protected building. However, in this instance, the part of the building to be removed detracts from the overall special interest and so that part of policy GP5 is met.

The eastern ridged part of the rear of the building appears to date from pre-1898 and the new extension would be attached to this part of the building. However, the current render appears modern and so the small amount of harm to the Protected Building would be outweighed by the reasonable aspirations of the owner.

It is considered that there would be minimal harm to the special interest of the setting of the adjoining protected building and, again, this is outweighed by the reasonable aspirations of the owner. The proposals are not considered to have any detrimental impacts upon the special character and appearance of the surrounding conservation area.

The proposals achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The extension will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The scale and massing of the new raised terrace is not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding conservation area, nor will it have any impact on either of the immediate neighbours due to over 1.8m boundary walls either side of the extension and majority of the terrace and the extent of the mature planting along the rest of the garden boundaries.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land Planning and Development (General Provisions) Ordinance, 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
