NOTIFICATION OF REFUSAL OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Erect single storey outbuilding and raised terrace to west of site.

LOCATION: Fleur De Lys, La Grande Rue, St. Saviour.

The Development & Planning Authority has decided to refuse your application under the provisions of section 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 for the following reasons:-

1. Notwithstanding the statement submitted in support of the application, by virtue of the location of the proposed building, it cannot be considered well-related to the existing dwelling. The combination of the siting over 47m away from the main dwelling, the size (80 sqm excluding the raised decking area) and nature of the proposed building would result in the development competing with the existing dwelling and indicates that the proposal would not be ancillary to the existing dwelling. It has not been demonstrated that the proposal constitutes householder development ancillary to an existing dwelling and therefore the proposal does not accord with Policy GP13.

OTHER REMARKS:-**Right of appeal against planning decisions**

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, against a decision to refuse an application for planning permission or outline planning permission to the Planning Tribunal on the merits. RECOMMENDATION - Refusal with Reasons:

REASONS FOR REFUSAL

1. Notwithstanding the statement submitted in support of the application, by virtue of the location of the proposed building, it cannot be considered well-related to the existing dwelling. The combination of the siting over 47m away from the main dwelling, the size (80 sqm excluding the raised decking area) and nature of the proposed building would result in the development competing with the existing dwelling and indicates that the proposal would not be ancillary to the existing dwelling. It has not been demonstrated that the proposal constitutes householder development ancillary to an existing dwelling and therefore the proposal does not accord with Policy GP13.

OFFICER'S REPORT

Site Description:

The property known as 'Fleur de Lys' is a 1970's detached two storey dwelling which is set back (at a higher level) from and faces north onto La Grande Rue. There are neighbouring detached dwellings to the east and west and across the road to the north. The property's garden is set at a higher level again to the south and beyond this are open fields. The property is located Outside of the Centres as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Relevant History:

FULL/2023/2233 - Erect single storey outbuilding/summer house and raised terrace area to west of site – Withdrawn 5th January 2024.

FULL/2023/2226 - Demolish extension, erect two storey and single storey extensions and alterations to landscaping to south (rear) elevation – Approved 19th December 2023.

FULL/2023/2224 - Alterations to gated vehicle and pedestrian accesses and parking areas to east and west of property – Approved 20th December 2023.

Existing Use(s):

Residential use class 1: dwelling house.

Brief Description of Development:

This application is to erect a single storey outbuilding and raised terrace to the west of the site and at a much higher level than the main dwelling.

A statement has been submitted in support of the application outlining that the building would be used for health and fitness purposes and entertaining and would be ancillary to the enjoyment of the dwelling.

Assessment against:**1 - Purposes of the law.**

The objectives of the Law, as set out in Section 1(2), have been considered and this forms part of the assessment of policy issues as set out in 2 below.

2 - Relevant policies of any Plan, Subject Plan or Local Planning Brief.

Policy GP13 indicates that proposals for extensions and alterations to existing residential properties will be supported subject to certain criteria being met including with regards to the impact on the amenities of neighbouring properties, taking into account the surrounding character and where they accord with all the relevant policies of the Island

Development Plan. In this instance Policies GP1, GP8 and GP9 are also relevant. In addition, the preceding text of Policy GP13 refers to the need to consider the material planning considerations as specified in Part IV, Section 13 of the Land Planning and Development (General Provisions) Ordinance 2007. These include the appropriateness of the development in relation to its surroundings in terms of its design, layout, scale, siting and the materials to be used, as well as its likely effect on the character and amenity of the locality in question and its likely effect on the reasonable enjoyment of neighbouring properties.

The proposed outbuilding is over 47m away from the main dwelling and sited at a much higher level. The main dwelling faces north onto La Grande Rue and the proposed outbuilding faces northwest looking towards Ruelle de la Bataille, which runs along the west boundary.

Notwithstanding the statement submitted in support of the application, by virtue of the location of the proposed building, it cannot be considered well-related to the existing dwelling. The combination of the siting over 47m away from the main dwelling, the size (80 sqm excluding the raised decking area) and nature of the proposed building would result in the development competing with the existing dwelling and indicates that the proposal would not be ancillary to the existing dwelling. It has not been demonstrated that the proposal constitutes householder development ancillary to an existing dwelling and therefore the proposal does not accord with Policy GP13.

Therefore for the reasons above the proposals are not considered to be acceptable and the recommendation for this application is one of a refusal.
