NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Raise roof ridge to create additional accommodation at 1st floor level with balcony and external steps to south-east elevation to detached outbuilding/garage.

LOCATION: La Marette, Rue Des Marettes, St. Martin.

This permission is granted under the terms of Sections 15 and 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 (the 'Law').

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 17/04/2027 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

For the avoidance of doubt, this decision permits the erection of an extension to be used as an integral part of and incidental to the principal dwelling presently known as La Marette. It does not permit the creation of a separately occupied annex or an independent dwelling. This would require a separate grant of planning permission and involve different planning policy considerations.

Your attention is drawn to The Animal Welfare (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2012, the local Strategy for Nature and the need to comply with their legal provisions. The existing building may be used by bats or other wildlife for roosting and nesting. We strongly recommend that the site is inspected by a suitably qualified person prior to any building works. Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

(1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. The official Appeal Notice Forms are available on the States of Guernsey website at www.gov.gg/planningpanel and must be completed with all enclosures in multiples as requested and received within the six months deadline.

OFFICER'S REPORT

Description:

The property known as 'La Marette' is a large detached two and a half storey dwelling, the main part of the dwelling was built in the early 20th century and it was re-modelled and extended at the turn of the 21st century. The building is set back from and faces northeast onto Rue des Marettes and is situated within a large site. There is one neighbour to the north across the road. Other than the northerly neighbour the property is surrounded by agricultural land and is located within the Agriculture Priority Area. The property is located Outside of the Centres as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Relevant History:

FULL/2023/1009 – Erect extension at 1st floor level to southwest (rear) elevation – Approved August 2023.

FULL/2023/0338 - Erect canopies to south-west (rear) and south-east (side) elevations – Approved April 2023.

La Societe Guernesiaise

'In respect of this application, we would like to highlight that buildings of this type can be used by roosting bats. This likelihood can increase when the property is located within a variable landscape with habitats such as farmland or woodland nearby. The ongoing Bailiwick Bat Survey has shown that there are bat populations in this particular part of the island.

We would recommend that the existing buildings, in particular the roof spaces, be inspected for current or recent use by bats by a suitably qualified person prior to any building works. This would reduce the risk of disturbing or destroying animals which are legally protected under the Animal Welfare Ordinance 2012.

We would request that, if this application is considered further, an informative note be added to the Information Sheet as follows -

'Your attention is drawn to The Animal Welfare (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2012, the local Strategy for Nature and the need to comply with their legal provisions. The existing building may be used by bats or other wildlife for roosting and nesting. We strongly recommend that the site is inspected by a suitably qualified person prior to any building works. Additional measures should also be taken (including consideration of the timing of the works and provision to support associated wildlife in the long term) to ensure that protected species are not impacted by the works. Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to raise the roof of the detached garage to enable additional accommodation at first floor level, with a balcony and external steps to the southeast elevation. The additional accommodation will comprise a bedroom, a

bathroom and a kitchenette/living area at first floor level reached via the external staircase with a balcony outside the front door.

The detached garage is approx. 10m away from the main dwelling, all the utilities will remain shared with the main dwelling and there will be limited facilities in the proposed kitchenette, all of which means the proposed additional accommodation could not be lived in independently. It is recommended that for the avoidance of any doubt an informative is included on any permission to ensure that the accommodation provided remains ancillary to the main dwellinghouse.

The proposals are considered to achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The extension will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The scale and massing of the new extension is not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding area, nor will it have any impacts on the northerly neighbour.

La Societe Guerneslaise have highlighted that St Martins is an area where bats can be found in roof spaces. As this existing garage is a flat roof, it is unlikely that bats will be found however, we will add the informative as requested just in case any bats are in residence.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land Planning and Development (General Provisions) Ordinance, 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
