NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Remove garage door and install window and door to east elevation and alterations to fenestration of outbuilding. Remove section of roadside wall to widen existing vehicle access.

LOCATION: St Catherine, La Neuve Rue, L'Aumone, Castel.

This permission is granted under the terms of Sections 15 and 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 (the 'Law').

Conditions and reasons:-

1. All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3. The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

4. Within four weeks of the existing access being extended, the ends of the extended opening and the adjacent section of roadside wall shall be finished off in accordance with the approved plans.

Reason - To secure the satisfactory appearance of the completed development in a timely manner.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 12/06/2027 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

(1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'St Catherine' is a mid-20th century bungalow with a detached garage. The property is set back from and faces east onto La Neuve Rue. There are neighbouring properties to the north, south and west and open land to the east across the road. The property is located in the L'Aumone Local Centre as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Relevant History:

FULL/2021/0289 - Erect single storey extension to west (rear) elevation, install external insulating render system and erect detached garage to south (side) elevation – Approved April 2021.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to convert the garage into a hobby room by removing the window on the west elevation and the western window on the north elevation, and removing the east elevation garage door and replacing it with a single door and window.

These elements are considered to achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The alterations will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The scale and massing of the proposals are not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding area, nor will they have any impact on either of the immediate neighbours.

The second part of the application is to widen the existing vehicular opening from approx. 2.8m to 5m. The driveway slopes down to the road and at present is extremely tight, allowing the opening to increase will enhance road safety, as long as the reconstructed section of roadside boundary is at a maximum height of 900mm, which will allow for good sightlines. The application was deferred to allow the drawing to be amended to show a 900mm high wall.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land Planning and Development (General Provisions) Ordinance, 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
