NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Demolish outbuilding and glasshouse, erect single storey extension to east (side) elevation and alterations to fenestration, alter ground levels to widen vehicle access and extend parking area.

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

4.If, during any development, contamination not previously identified is found to be present at the site then no further development shall be carried out until the applicant has submitted to the Authority a method statement to identify, risk assess and address the unidentified contaminants, and obtained written agreement from the Authority for the works to continue. Any subsequent works shall be carried out only in accordance with the conclusions and recommendations contained in the agreed report.

Reason - To make sure that the site, when developed is free from contamination, in the interests of public health and safety.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 25/09/2028 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

(1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. The official Appeal Notice Forms are available on the States of Guernsey website at www.gov.gg/planningpanel and must be completed with all enclosures in multiples as requested and received within the six months deadline.

OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'Le Chalet' is a mid-20th century bungalow which is set back from and faces north onto Rue des Emrais. There are neighbouring properties to the west and across the road to the north, an open agricultural field to the south and an old vinery (now overgrown) to the east. The property is located Outside of the Centres as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Relevant History:

There is no relevant history pertaining to this application.

'I have reviewed the proposed plans to demolish an outbuilding and erect a single storey extension at the above site.

I have interrogated the States' Digimap system and records, which show that glasshouses were historically located on the land parcel.

It is not known whether any contaminated land surveys have been carried out historically as part of any previous development at the site, which would assess any risks posed by historical heated glasshouse use. Without knowing this, there is the potential for land contamination to be present and I have concerns that there could be contamination of metals, hydrocarbons and pesticides from this historic use. Other sources of contamination could also be present.

I would advise that the applicant is made aware of this potential risk, and I recommend that the following condition is attached to any granted permission:

- If, during any development, contamination not previously identified is found to be present at the site then no further development shall be carried out until the applicant has submitted to the Authority a method statement to identify, risk assess and address the unidentified contaminants, and obtained written agreement from the Authority for the works to continue. Any subsequent works shall be carried out only in accordance with the conclusions and recommendations contained in the agreed report.*

I would be grateful if these issues are considered during the determination of this application.'

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to demolish the existing detached garage and domestic greenhouse, and erect a single storey extension to the east side of the property, with some alterations to the fenestration. As well as alter the ground levels to the north of the property and widen the existing vehicular entrance to extend the parking area.

Rue des Emrais is a very narrow lane and the existing width of the vehicular opening is only 2.5m, which is very tight. The lane has several large vehicular openings in the area to allow large vehicles to enter and exit each of the properties. Due to the bend in the road, the large openings have not impacted on the rural nature of the road, and widening the roadside boundary for Le Chalet is considered appropriate and acceptable.

The extension will be built on the elevation that is away from the neighbours, is single storey, and will improve the layout of the property. The proposals are considered to achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The extension will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The scale and massing of the new extension is not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding area, nor will it have any impact on any of the immediate neighbours.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions, including the condition from Environmental Health.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land Planning and Development (General Provisions) Ordinance, 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
