NOTIFICATION OF GRANT OF PLANNING PERMISSION

PROPOSALS: Erect first floor extension to south (rear) elevation and install rooflight to north (front) elevation.

LOCATION: Baqueira, Allington Drive, La Rue De La Corbinerie, St. Martin.

This permission is granted under the terms of Sections 15 and 16 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 (the 'Law').

Conditions and reasons:-

1.All development authorised by this permission must be carried out and must be completed in every detail in accordance with the written application, plans and drawings referred to above. No variations to such development amounting to development may be made without the permission of the Authority under the Law.

Reason - To ensure that it is clear that permission is only granted for the development to which the application relates.

2.The development hereby permitted shall be begun within 3 years from the date of grant of this permission.

Reason - This condition reflects section 18(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 which states that planning permission ceases to have effect

unless development is commenced within 3 years of the date of grant (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

3.The development hereby permitted and all the operations which constitute or are incidental to that development must be carried out in compliance with all such requirements of The Building (Guernsey) Regulations, 2012 as are applicable to them, and no operation to which such a requirement applies may be commenced or continued unless (i) plans relating to that operation have been approved by the Authority and (ii) it is commenced or, as the case may be, continued, in accordance with that requirement and any further requirements imposed by the Authority when approving those plans, for the purpose of securing that the building regulations are complied with.

Reason - Any planning permission granted under the Law is subject to this condition as stated in section 17(2) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005.

4.The cill of all rooflights serving the first floor accommodation shall be set a minimum of 1.8 metres above the first (finished) floor level.

Reason: To minimise the effect of the development on the privacy and amenities of nearby residents.

5.The approved first floor bedroom room window in the southwest elevation shall be glazed with obscure glass to a minimum level 3 on the Pilkington scale (or equivalent), and shall be fixed shut up to a height of 1.7m and thereafter be retained at all times. The opening light shall be top hung only. No changes shall be made to this window.

Reason - To minimise the effect of the development on the privacy and amenities of nearby residents.

Expiry Date: This permission will cease to have effect on 30/03/2029 unless development is commenced by that date.

ADVICE AND OTHER REMARKS:-

Effect of planning permission:

Section 18 of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 ('the Law') defines the effect of the planning permission hereby granted, namely:

- (1) Planning permission ceases to have effect unless the development permitted by it is commenced within a period of three years immediately following the date on which it is granted (or such shorter period as may be specified in the permission).

(2) Planning permission enures for the benefit of the land concerned and of every person for the time being having an interest in it.

(3) Any conditions subject to which planning permission is issued are enforceable in accordance with the provisions of Part V of the Law.

(4) Planning permission for the erection of a building is only permission to use it for the purpose specified in the permission or, subject to any restriction so specified, for any other purpose for which it is designed.

(5) Planning permission is only permission to carry out the development specified in it (subject to any conditions so specified), and does not imply the giving of any other approval or consent required under this Law or any other enactment or under any rule of law.

Right of appeal against planning decisions:

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 68(1) of the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law 2005, which provides a right of appeal, on the merits against a decision to grant planning permission subject to conditions (except a building condition), to the Planning Tribunal, which is independent of the States of Guernsey. An appeal to the Planning Tribunal under section 68 of the Law against this decision must be made before the expiry of the period of six months beginning with the date on which the Authority made this decision. OFFICER'S REPORT

Brief Description of the site:

The property known as 'Baqueira' is a new build property completed in 2022, it is a detached one and a half storey dwelling which is located behind the ribbon development to the northwest of Les Frieteaux and behind the ribbon development to the south of Les Oberlands, vehicular access is from Les Oberlands in the north. To the southeast is another new build that shares the same vehicular entrance and there are other residential developments in each direction. The property is located in the St Peter Port Main Centre Outer Area as defined in the Island Development Plan.

Conclusion/Brief comment:

This application is to erect a first-floor extension over the existing flat roof part of the kitchen/diner, to the southwest elevation and install one rooflight to the northeast front elevation.

The southwest facing proposed first floor window will look directly southwest where there is over 16m to the boundary, from an oblique angle the west boundary of the site is just over 6m away, but the boundary at present consists of a 4m high hedge, however we cannot rely on hedges to screen overlooking, the application was deferred to allow for a change in the fenestration. The full-length window will now have obscure fixed shut glazing up to a cill level of 1.7m and above this will be a top hung opening light. The rooflight for the bedroom will also be enlarged but remain at a 1.8m high cill level.

The northeast facing rooflight is considered an appropriate and acceptable addition to the front facade. To ensure consistency with the original approval for the two properties, the same condition regarding rooflights will be added to this permission, requesting the cill level of the rooflights to be 1.8m above the finished floor level.

The proposals are considered to achieve a good standard of design, using materials which complement the existing materials. The extension will provide adequate levels of sunshine and daylight, and give the occupiers more flexible and adaptable accommodation.

The scale and massing of the new extension is not considered to have a detrimental effect on the character and amenity of the surrounding area, nor will it have an unacceptable impact on either of the immediate neighbours.

Confirmation has been received that the development proposed has been designed to take into account matters of energy efficiency and current Building Regulations in accordance with Policy GP9.

The proposals are considered to conform to the above policies of the Island Development Plan and grant of permission is recommended, subject to conditions.

All material considerations as set out in the Land Planning and Development (Guernsey) Law, 2005 and the Land Planning and Development (General Provisions) Ordinance, 2007 have been taken into account in the assessment of this application.
